1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

RESOLVED to consent to these absences

2. ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR

REPORTED that

(a) a letter had been sent out to members inviting nominations for the positions of Chair and Vice Chair. No nominations had been received.

(b) Nominations were invited from those present. Sabah Raza confirmed her intention to stand down as Chair of SACRE, however was prepared to continue to chair this meeting.

RESOLVED that Sabah Raza continue in the chair for the remainder of the meeting.

RESOLVED that a roving Chair from each group would be implemented for the immediate future. Cllr James Hockney kindly volunteered to Chair the November 2021 SACRE meeting. The Chair extended her thanks to Cllr Hockney.

3. **MEMBERSHIP AND WELCOME**

The Chair welcomed members and guest presenter to the meeting.

RESOLVED that Muhammad Ibrahim, Navaratnam Shanmuganathan and Rubbina Umar would be removed from the SACRE membership. It was hoped that these vacancies could be filled as quickly as possible.

4. **MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 9 FEBRUARY 2021**

The Minutes of the meeting held on 9 February 2021 were confirmed as a correct record.

5. **MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES DATED 9 FEBRUARY 2021**

REPORTED that all outstanding items under matters arising had been actioned, were in hand or included as an agenda item at this meeting.

The following issues arose through consideration and discussion of the minutes and matters arising.

REPORTED the following updates

Ozlem Onay, Group C had prepared a draft celebration letter to Primary Schools that achieve the REQM;

The Revd. Tina Kelsey, Group B had prepared a draft letter to schools who had expressed an interest in having a SACRE member attend a school Collective Worship session;

Cllr Rye, OBE, Group D had prepared a draft letter to schools not using the Enfield SACRE Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education.

The Chair expressed thanks for members submissions.

REPORTED that this had not been created yet.

REPORTED by the Chair recent compliments received from the Hinduism Education Board on the quality of the SACRE Website

Item 10 – Enfield LA Faith Forum 2022 Faith Calendar

REPORTED by Nick Chanda that this would be raised at the Faith Forum meeting in the Autumn Term 2021 after which feedback would be provided to SACRE members.

BUSINESS ITEMS

Improving standards in religious education and collective worship

6. AGREED SYLLABUS 2022 PREPARATION

REPORTED that every five years a Local Authority has to review and if necessary, update its Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education. In order to do this, it must establish an Agreed Syllabus Conference (ASC). As previously advised by the Chair, the current Enfield Agreed Syllabus and Schemes of Work (SoW) are no longer fit for purpose.

NOTED that Enfield SACRE will from September 2021 need to consider a new syllabus and accompanying schemes of work. SACRE will wish to discuss the guidance before an ASC takes place and may wish to recommend guidance with recommendations on additional religions which might be taught and which key stage alongside Christianity and whether to include Non-Religious World Views and Alevism. This would increase the current SoW units from 33 to 35. The two additional SoWs are recommended for SACREs consideration.

Humanism – Non-religious world views

SACRE members welcomed Luke, representing Humanists UK who had been invited to give a short presentation on **Humanism – Non-religious world views**.

Luke advised from Census reports that an increasing number of people are non-religious and self-identify with the term 'humanist'. Therefore, it is vital that every young person learns about the different religions that are common in the UK today, as well as humanism.

Teaching about humanism helps schools deliver a fair and balanced education that ensures the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of all young people. Humanists UK believe that teaching a diverse range of beliefs and values helps schools develop the whole person. A number of comprehensive teaching resources are freely available at:

Humanism in 5 Themes

- 1) The human being (evolved, potential)
- 2) The natural world (science, atheism)
- 3) The one life (happiness, freedom)
- 4) Morality (empathy, consequences, golden rule)
- 5) Goals and actions (responsibility, human rights, secularism)

SACRE members thanked Luke for an interesting and information presentation.

Alevism

SACRE members invited Cllr Ergin Erbil and Hasan Boluceh to present to the meeting an update on Alevism as part of the Religious Education curriculum and to give an insight into the local context.

NOTED that the Prince of Wales Primary School had identified an underachieving group of Alevi pupils and that the lack of cultural identity was proving to be a barrier for the Alevi pupils' achievement and learning. One of the Deputy Headteachers became involved in creating an

innovative scheme of work unit on Alevism, initially for her primary school and one that she subsequently shared with other schools across Enfield.

Why teach this unique belief system

- 1) Diversity in general knowledge
- 2) Increase in awareness in British Alevi culture
- 3) Increase in understanding of Alevism for Alevi pupils and sense of belonging within the Alevi community
- 4) Mutual understanding, respect and tolerance of other religions and cultures

SACRE members thanked Cllr Erbil and Hasan for an interesting and informative presentation. Members also highly commended the active work of the British Alevi Federation and the local Alevi Cultural Centre not just in Enfield but also in Barnet.

Recommendations made by Sabah Raza – Enfield SACRE Chair 2018-2021

Sabah advised that there are several different options for a new syllabus, each with their own funding implications including the cost of the launch and training of subject leads.

NOTED that the SACRE could adopt an 'off the peg' syllabus from another borough or have a bespoke syllabus written representing the faiths and beliefs across Enfield. Either way, the Agreed Syllabus is one of the most important duties and responsibilities of a SACRE.

The recommendation is that whichever option the SACRE decides upon, the following should be added to the new syllabus:

- Increase allocated RE curriculum time from 35 mins per week a KS1 to 45 minutes and 45 mins (KS2) to 1 hour.
- Include a unit teaching the Alevi faith
- Include a unit teaching a non-religious world view (NRWV) - Humanism
- Include guidance for SEND children and schools
- Consider how the new syllabus relates to the new Education Inspection Framework (EIF) and the NCFRE (2013)
- Add in Enfield SACRE's vision for RE/RS: intent, implementation and impact
- Consider a change of name for the subject to be more inclusive (Commission on RE Report 2018)
- Ensure the syllabus promotes anti-racist RE and guidance
- Consider writing and including SACRE guidance for Ramadan 2022
- Re-word 'should' to 'must' and for elements of RE teaching that schools are expected to do, so they will be classed as statutory.

Agreed Syllabus Options (not exhaustive)

1) RE Today:

- a. An adviser looking through Enfield's current syllabus and giving suggestions on what tweaks might be made in the future to update it.
- b. Units of work written to accompany Enfield's current syllabus.

- c. If Enfield are looking to change their syllabus dramatically, then many LAs have purchased and adopted one of RE Today's model syllabuses (there are two models to choose from) or asked RE Today to write a bespoke syllabus for them (this would be the most expensive option).

Option A would need to be done before anything else. Any new units that are written should really be written with the 2022 syllabus in mind rather than just being created for the next couple of years. Charge £375 + VAT for half day's work looking at the syllabus and making recommendations, or £700 + VAT for a full day's work.

2) Purchase another Borough's Syllabus:

Barnet Agreed Syllabus written in 2019: Thematic

Norfolk Agreed Syllabus written in 2019: Divided in to 3 strands of philosophy, theology and human/social sciences

3) Purchase the 'Discovery RE' Scheme of Work

- comprehensive set of detailed medium-term planning for RE from Nursery to Year 6
- 64 Enquiry modules covering Christianity, Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism and Sikhism support the teacher to deliver engaging and challenging RE lessons with confidence
- Does not include NRW
- They 'map' the scheme to the Agreed Syllabus to see if it is relevant

Additional SACRE tasks to consider:

- Prepare an application form for schools to apply for a determination

7. ANNUAL REPORT 2019-2020

REPORTED that the Enfield SACRE Annual Report 2019-2020 had been sent to the DfE and to NASACRE.

8. REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2020-2022

REPORTED that the Chair had attended a recent Barnet SACRE meeting and provided an update to SACRE members on this positive experience.

RESOLVED to review progress of the SACRE Development Plan 2020-2022 at the Autumn Term 2021 meeting

10. RAMADAN GUIDANCE

RECEIVED an update on the Ramadan Guidance sent to schools after an enquiry was received on primary school children fasting from an Enfield school.

REPORTED that there did not seem to be any central advice on this, although a number of other SACREs had produced their own advice documents and Newham SACRE had kindly shared their own guidance which was shared with Enfield Headteachers through the Enfield Council 'Hub'.

NOTED that there are different interpretations of what can and should happen when it comes to primary school children and that it may be useful for Enfield SACRE to work with our local communities, Imams and mosques to create one for the future.

11. SECONDARY RS TEACH MEET UPDATE

RECEIVED an update on recent collaboration with Newham's SACRE Secondary RS online TeachMeet which was led by Claire Clinton, the Newham and Barking & Dagenham Director of RE and the London Regional Ambassador for RE.

REPORTED that this had been a fantastic opportunity for Secondary RS Teachers to join the meeting for free and of keeping up with the latest RS guidance, support, resources and the chance to share good practice and network with other local secondary schools.

12. CLOSING THE GENDER GAP IN RS

RECEIVED an update on ideas to support secondary schools to increase the uptake of RS by boys as the analysis of the 2019 examination data had revealed a gender gap where girls were achieving considerably higher grades in GCSE RS studies than boys; whilst the A level data showed that out of 73 entries across the borough, only 18 of these were boys.

REPORTED that an Aylward Academy had noted some success where a male RE Teacher had inspired boys and where an Alevi Scheme of Work was taught. The teacher had been contacted and it was hoped that he would put together a short video to promote RS at secondary level.
